

Scholarships Offered to LANCASTER COUNTY HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS



Under the Universal Application: (March 15 Deadline):

Beistle Company Scholarship: for students who are legal dependents (natural or adopted) of full-time employees of the Beistle Company. Applicants must be United States citizens accepted for admission to an accredited college, university or graduate school, demonstrate academic promise and achievement and financial need, and be involved in the community (number of recipients vary/up to \$1,000 each per year for up to 4 years).

Drane and Steele Music Fund: for students from Adams, Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Fulton, Juniata, Lancaster, Lebanon, Montour, Northumberland, Perry, Snyder, and York counties, studying classical music composition, teaching, and performance (multiple winners/up to \$5,000).

Eash-Potter Scholarship: (for graduating high school seniors from Adams, Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Lancaster, Lebanon, Perry and York counties who participate in activities to improve the school or community climate for LGBTQ people (number of recipients vary/amount varies).

Bruce Mangione Fund: for students who attend school within the city of Harrisburg or are children of the employees of NRG Energy (Harrisburg office) or Harrisburg Hilton and Towers, and are involved in the community and demonstrate strong work ethic, good scholastic performance and financial need (2 winners/up to \$1,500).

Douglas W. Pfautz Memorial Scholarship Fund:: for graduating high school seniors who are legal residents of the Elizabethtown Area School District attending public or private school in good academic standing and moral character. Applicants must have a commitment to community service, plan to attend a two-year or four-year college, university, or trade school as a full-time student, and demonstrate financial need. (number of recipients vary/up to \$500).

Gary D. Radine Scholarship: for dependent children of a Delta Dental employee attending a two-year or four-year accredited college as a full-student. Applicants must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 and participated in extracurricular and community service activities, and have work experience and financial need (2 winners/\$5,000 each).

Mary Sachs Memorial Award: For graduating female high school seniors in Cumberland, Dauphin, Perry, or Lancaster counties with plans to study fashion, fashion design, retailing, entrepreneurship, or business. Applicants should plan to attend any two-year or four-year college, university or trade school and preference will be given to students attending a school in Pennsylvania (number of recipients vary/amount varies).

Kahl Family Scholarship: For a graduating Ephrata High School senior who is planning attend a post-secondary institution full time, has a GPA of at least a 2.5,is involved in their community and is involved in any performing musical ensemble (band, choir, etc) (Multiple awards/\$3000)

Conrad Siegel "Numbers Matter Scholarship: For graduating seniors who are pursuing a degree in Math, Actuarial Science, Business Math or Finance at a 4 year college. (multiple winners/up to \$5000)

Royer Family Scholarship: The Royer family have established this fund to help their employees, their children or grandchildren gain additional education to help them succeed in life. This scholarship is available for trade, 2 or 4-year post high school continued education for full or part-time students. (Up to 4 awards/ \$1000-\$2500)

Big 33 Academic Scholarship: for students in PA planning to attend a technical school or accredited college or university following high school graduation. (Multiple winners/ up to \$2,000 each)

Grove Family Fund #2- HACC: for students attending Harrisburg Area Community College as a full-time or part time student. Minimum GPA of 2.0 or higher (Two recipients/Amount varies)

Walters Services, Inc. Fabe & Beverly Walters Scholarship: Applicants must be children of employees under the age of 26, or must be a seasonal employee under the age of 26, with plans to attend college, university, or a trade school as a full-time or part-time student. (Number of recipients varies/Amount varies)

Dr. George H. and Mrs. Hettie S. Love "Love of Learning" Scholarship: The Dr. George H. and Mrs. Hettie S. Love "Love of Learning" Scholarship is established by the Bishop Nathan Baxter Chapter of the Union of Black Episcopalians for Students of Color with a primary focus on the Black community, entering a 2-year or 4-year college majoring in Education.

Stand Alone Applications (Varying deadlines):

Leader Scholarship Fund: (Nov. 15) for graduating high school seniors from Cumberland, Dauphin, Lancaster, or York counties with plans to attend HACC Harrisburg's campus as a full-time student to study in the LPN Program. Applicants should have a minimum cumulative high school GPA of 2.5 and demonstrate a financial need (number of recipients vary/amount varies).

Penn HOSA Foundation Scholarship: (March 15) for affiliated, paid HOSA chapter members by January 1 with financial need (multiple winners/amount varies).

The Pennsylvania House of Representatives Scholarship: (March 1) for graduating high school seniors and legal residents of Pennsylvania planning on attending a Pennsylvania college, university, or career school full-time. Applicants should have a minimum cumulative high school GPA of 3.0 and show a commitment to their community and extracurricular activities, demonstrate leadership qualities, and have a financial need (2 winners/amount varies).

Apply on their website:

PARTS Scholarship Pennsylvania Automotive Recycling Trade Society: for children or step children of an owner or an employee of an eligible active PARTS member or an employee who has worked for an eligible PARTS member for at least one year prior to March 15. Applicants must be enrolled as a student at any accredited post-high school institution with personal and academic plans and a financial need (multiple winners/a

mount varies).

Central PA Architects Foundation Scholarship: Students who are present or former residents of one of the following Pennsylvania counties: Adams, Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Fulton, Juniata, Lancaster, Lebanon, Montour, Northumberland, Perry, Snyder, or York, and currently enrolled in an architecture degree program. https://aiacentralpa.org/cpaff-scholarship-application/

MATCHING AWARD OPPORTUNITIES

AES/PHEAA's PATH Program: Scholarship recipients are eligible to have their awards matched on a dollar-for-dollar basis by AES/PHEAA's PATH ("Partnerships for Access to Higher Education") Program. PHEAA may grant matching funds to scholarship recipients who are enrolled in an approved Pennsylvania college or career school as an undergraduate student on at least a half-time basis, who are a Pennsylvania state grant recipient and who demonstrate financial need. Students must also be a resident of Pennsylvania, not in default on any educational loans, maintain academic progress, and not be considered an incarcerated student. The match provides last-dollar support for tuition and fees. Scholarship funds used for reimbursement of textbook purchases are not eligible for a PATH Program match. The scholarship recipient's information is submitted to PHEAA by TFEC staff. No additional work will be asked of the scholarship recipient.
